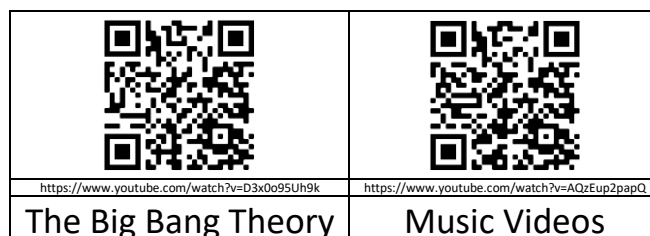


What if ...?

And another thing – if I (have) had a job, I wouldn't see my friends so often. Hmm... maybe I won't get a job!
