



#### **Black music**

For 400 years, since the first black slaves arrived in America in 1619, black music has changed the look<sup>1</sup> and sound of music in the US. From spirituals to contemporary<sup>2</sup> R&B, here are ten important black music styles.

**SPIRITUALS** The earliest black songs in the US were the work songs and spirituals that the slaves sang in the fields. Spirituals were religious songs that gave hope of a hetter future to the slaves. One very famous spiritual is 'Swing low, sweet chariot'<sup>3</sup>. Gospel music, which started in the African American churches in the earl 1900s. comes from the spirituals sung by southern slaves.




**BLUES** Slavery was abolished<sup>4</sup> in 1865. As blacks moved north to the towns, a new type of black music was born – the blues. Robert Johnson was one of the most famous blues musicians<sup>5</sup>, and there were many more great blues singers, like Ma Rainey and Bessie Smith.





R&B Rhythm and blues was a music style that started in the 1930s and 1940s. It was a mix of jazz, gospe and blues music. Ruth Brown, Bo Diddley and Fats Domino were popular R&B artists at that time.

**Solution ROCK 'N' ROLL** In the 1950s, the first rock 'n' roll songs were played by black artists. 'Tutti Frutti' by Little Richard and 'Johnny B. Goode' by Chuck Berry were two of the first rock 'n' roll songs.

**Soull** Soul came from R&B and gospel. It was started in the late 1950s by black artists like Sam Cooke, Ray Charles and James Brown. In the 1960s one of the most popular soul stars was Aretha Franklin. People call her 'The Ourong of Soul'



DISCO In the 1970s, black disco stars, like B.T. Express, Kool and the Gang, Sister Sledge and Donna Summer, were popular.



RAP AND HIP HOP In 1979, The Sugar Hill Gang produced the first rap hit, 'Rapper's Delight'. This was the start of a new sound in the music world.

**NEO SOUL** In the late 1990s there was a new mix of sounds which people called neo soul. It was made up of hip hop, reggae, jazz, soul and Latin music. Lauryn Hill, Erykah Badu and Alicia Keys are amous neo soul artists of the 1990s and 2000s.



**CONTEMPORARY R&B** Contemporary R&B is a style of music that comes from soul, funk and disco. Today, blacl R&B singers like Beyoncé, LeToya, Usher and Ne-Yo are continuing<sup>1</sup> the black music tradition in the US.



#### How do we make the Present Perfect Tense?

subject	+	auxiliary <i>have</i> conjugated in Present Simple have, has	+	main verb past participle
---------	---	--------------------------------------------------------------------	---	------------------------------

- The auxiliary verb (have) is conjugated in the Present Simple: have, has
- The main verb is invariable in past participle form: -ed (or irregular)
- For negative sentences we insert **NOT** <u>between</u> the auxiliary verb and the main verb.
- For question sentences, we **exchange** the subject and the auxiliary verb.

Martin Luther King, Jr. (January 15, 1929 – April 4, 1968) was an activist and leader in the African-American Civil Rights Movement.

King started to fight racism very early. He led the 1955 Montgomery Bus Boycott (Blacks hat to sit only in the back of the buses). King helped to organize the 1963 nonviolent protests in Birmingham, Alabama and the 1963 March on Washington, where he gave his famous "I Have a Dream" speech.

On October 14, 1964, King got the Nobel Peace Prize for fighting racism. In 1965, he helped to organize the marches from Selma to Montgomery. In the last years of his life, King fought against poverty and spoke against the Vietnam War.

In 1968 he was killed on April 4 in Memphis, Tennessee.




**Oprah Gail Winfrey** (born January 29, 1954) is an American talk show host, actress and producer. Winfrey is famous for her talk show *The Oprah Winfrey Show*, she is the richest African-American of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. She is one of the most influential women in the world. Winfrey was born into poverty in Mississippi. Life as a child was hard for her. Winfrey got a job in radio while she was still in high school. By the mid-1990s her show was about literature and getting along better in life. From 2006 to 2008 she supported Barack Obama. She interviewed Barack Obama, Michelle Obama, Lance Armstrong, Rihanna, Brad Pitt, Will.I.am and other famous people.




**Barack Hussein Obama II** (born August 4, 1961) is the 44th and current President of the United States. He was born in Honolulu, Hawaii. Obama is a student of Columbia University and Harvard Law School, where he served as president of the *Harvard Law Review*. He worked as a civil rights lawyer and taught constitutional law at University of Chicago Law School.

Nine months after being President, Obama won the 2009 Nobel Peace Prize.

Obama ended U.S. military participation in the Iraq War, increased U.S. troop levels in Afghanistan, ordered U.S. military participation in Libya and ordered the military operation that caused the death of Osama bin Laden.

Obama was reelected president in November 2012.




Alicia Augello Cook (born January 25, 1981), also known as Alicia Keys, is an American singer, songwriter, record producer, and actress. Keys' debut album, *Songs in A Minor*, sold over 12 million copies worldwide. She became the best-selling new artist and best-selling R&B artist of 2001. Keys won five Grammy Awards in 2002, including Best New Artist and Song of the Year for "Fallin'". Her second studio album, *The Diary of Alicia Keys*, was released in 2003 and was also another success worldwide, selling eight million copies. Later that year, she released her first live album.

Her third studio album, As I Am, was released in the same year and sold five million copies worldwide and she won an additional three Grammy Awards.

Keys won numerous awards and sold over 35 million albums and 30 million singles worldwide.



**Beyoncé Giselle Knowles-Carter** (born September 4, 1981) is an American singer-songwriter, and actress. Born and raised in Houston, Texas, she was the lead singer of R&B girl-group Destiny's Child. Managed by her father, Mathew Knowles, the group became one of the world's best-selling girl groups of all time. In June 2005, she released her second solo album, *B'Day* (2006) and she married rapper Jay Z.

Beyoncé creates songs that are about love, relationships and women empowerment. She has won 20 Grammy Awards and is the most nominated woman in the award's history. *Time* listed her among the 100 most influential people in the world in 2013 and 2014. Forbes magazine also listed her as the most powerful female musician of 2015.



**Rosa Louise McCauley Parks** (February 4, 1913 – October 24, 2005) was an African-American Civil Rights activist. The United States Congress called "the first lady of civil rights" and "the mother of the freedom movement".

On December 1, 1955, in Montgomery, Alabama, Parks refused to obey bus driver James F. Blake's order to give up her seat in the colored section to a white person, after the white section was filled. Parks was not the first person to resist bus segregation. She became very popular for fighting racism. She organized and collaborated with civil rights leaders like Martin Luther King.

Parks wrote her autobiography and lived in Detroit. Parks received national recognition such as the Presidential Medal of Freedom and the Congressional Gold Medal.
