(to) do volunteer work = (to) help people and work without getting money; freiwillig

shopping mall = a place with many shops where you can buy clothes; Einkaufspassage

(to) read the TV *listings* = the paper where you can find TV shows or movies: Fernsehzeitschrift

(to) watch a doc*umentary* = tells the facts about actual people and events; Dokumentation

(to) **be on** = a movie is shown on TV; gezeigt werden; laufen

(to) be disappointed about = you are sad about what happened; enttäuscht sein über

(to) be unbelieva**ble** = sth. is impossible to believe: unglaublich
